First	FYE	SOC 111 Introduction to Criminology	- These courses could be flipped—SOC 111 in the fall and CJ 101 in the spring—when available. - CJ electives: Majors are required to take 4 electives, two from Group A and two from Group B. At least 2 electives need to be at the 300-level or higher. Students should refer to the catalog and consult with their advisor for further details.

Second	CJ elective	SOC 210 Inequality and Social Justice	SOC 202 is just one choice that fulfills the research methods requirement for the CJRJC major. Other choices are POLS 200 and PSY 202. The research methods requirement should be taken in either the second or third year.

Fourth	CJ 410 The Capstone	CJ elective	The Capstone is only for CJRJC majors and should be taken in the fourth year (third year with permission of the instructor).
