This is a sample schedule to demonstrate a pathway through the major. Not every student will follow this path!

Some important points to note:

- Some required courses (SOC 141, SOC 202, PHIL 111/242, SOC 301, and SOC 402) are usually offered only
 once per year. If you are planning off-campus study, please make a plan to complete 141, 202, and 301
 before senior fall.
- SOC 225 (Health and Medicine) is preferred, but SOC 275 (Disability and Difference) can substitute. Usually
 one section (of one or the other) per year.
- PHIL 242 (Medical Ethics) is preferred, but PHIL 111 (Ethics) can substitute. Usually one section per year.
- PSY 334 (Practicum in Human Services) is offered every semester, but should be taken in the junior or senior year. Students may identify their own internship placement or work with the professor to find one, and must contact the professor before registering for the class.
- Most SOC classes have no prerequisites or have permissive prerequisites
- Try to pick electives that might provide methodological or subject-matter support for your eventual senior project as you come to decide what that might be... Even including courses outside of the major!
